A set up fee of \$25 is due at the time of sign-up and a deposit may be required to open your account. Customers that sign up for ACH Auto Pay are not required to make a deposit. ACH Auto Pay helps customers avoid late fees by having their utility payments automatically deducted from their bank account. For pets that have been spayed or neutered, the fee is \$15. Otherwise, the fee is \$35.

HISTORY & OVERVIEW

The first explorers documented in Spanish Fork were two Franciscan Friars named Silvestre Valadez de Escalante and Francisco Antanasio de Dominguez. Escalante and Dominguez were searching for a direct route from Santa Fe, New Mexico to Monterey, California when they camped in present-day Spanish Fork in 1776.

The area was mostly populated by the Ute Indian tribe until 1851 when Mormon pioneers also settled in the area. The relationship between early Spanish Fork residents and the Utes was relatively peaceable. Although very few battles have been documented between the different peoples, Spanish Fork residents built a fort to protect themselves within the City limits in 1854.

Enoch Reece was the first to build a home and claim to 400 acres of land in the Spanish Fork area. He was soon followed by his business partners, Charles Ferguson and George Sevey. Soon, many more families settled in the Spanish Fork area, and on January 19, 1855, it was officially incorporated as a city. Soon after incorporation, the first Icelandic immigrants settled in Spanish Fork.

Spanish Fork continued to thrive as it welcomed industry and education to its city limits when a sawmill and a school house opened in 1858 and 1862, respectively. In 1910, Thurber school was built, which now houses the City Offices.

Spanish Fork events and activities have many unique celebrations. Not only does it have Fiesta Days, accompanied by an incredible rodeo to celebrate its Spanish heritage, but it also has Icelandic Days to remember and celebrate the Icelandic heritage that settled here. Plus, the Festival of Lights, Harvest Moon Hurrah, and Wings & Wheels at the Airport are mustattend events.

Spanish Fork is a community that strives to maintain a high quality of life, and provides an outstanding environment for working, recreating, and enjoying life. City government is the Council-Manager form consisting of a part-time mayor and five part-time City Council members, along with an appointed full-time City manager who administers the operation of the City and its employees.

Pay for Utilities

Choose your bill payment option:

Autopay: Payment will automatically be deducted from your account;

Pay-by-phone: For residential accounts only (\$3 fee applies);

In-office: Visit our utility office in room 120 of the City Offices;

Online Payment: Payment will be processed using XpressBillPay; or

Drop Box: Drop off payment in the grey box in the Senior Center parking lot. (167 W Center)

Terminating Services

Terminate utility services over the phone by contacting Spanish Fork City at (801) 804-4505 Monday through Friday between 8 a.m. and 5 p.m.

If you have cable, internet, or phone services through SFCN, you are required to return all equipment (set top boxes, modems, etc.) to the utility office within 24 hours of your sign-out date. If you do not return equipment within 24 hours, charges for unreturned equipment will be added to your utility bill.

Your final bill will be mailed within 3 weeks of your termination date. If your account is set up on autopay, your final bill will be deducted automatically.

Drinking Water

All of Spanish Fork's drinking water system is supplied from springs. The City takes many precautions to ensure that the drinking water supply is safe including taking water samples each month at various locations throughout the City. Currently, Spanish Fork meets all state standards for water quality.

Utility Usage Portal

In 2021 we launched our Utility Usage Portal. This portal allows you to track your daily power and water consumption, even down to the gallon. Sign up at spanishfork.org/usageportal.



Pressurized Irrigation

The pressurized irrigation utility provides outdoor water for the City, primarily from the Spanish Fork River. The water is not treated and **should not** be used for drinking. The water is available for sprinkler systems from April 15 to October 15.

Home Energy Saving Tips

These quick home energy saving tips can help you make your home more comfortable, energy efficient, and help you save money:

- Monitor your usage with the Utility Usage Portal.
- Replace the air filters on your central air system regularly.
- Install a programmable thermostat.
- Insulate attic, outside walls, floors over crawl space, etc.
- Caulk, seal, and weather strip around windows and doors.
- Turn off electric water heater at breaker or set back gas water heater to "pilot", "vacation", or lowest heat setting when your home is vacant for 2 days or more.
- Clean refrigerator and freezer coils biannually.
- Check the gasket around your refrigerator door. Close the door on a piece of paper. If the paper slides out easily, adjust or replace the gasket.

The City shares a wastewater treatment plant with Mapleton and maintains over 150 miles of sewer collection pipe. The sewer division cleans about a quarter of the sewer lines each year and video inspects all lines once every seven years.

What can I do to help?

- Do not flush grease or oils into the sewer system. These products build up inside the collection pipe.
- Please try to avoid flushing feminine hygiene products and baby wipes, even "flushable" wipes, into the sewer. Flushing these products is the leading cause of sewer backups.
- Do not flush any type of medication into the sewer. For information, visit www.spanishfork.org/sewer

Senior Congregate Meals

CEMETERY

The Spanish Fork City Cemetery grounds are open every day of the year, including holidays, from dawn until dusk. Visitors are welcome and encouraged to walk the grounds. Animals are not permitted in the cemetery.

Decoration Removal

Shepherd Hooks are only allowed from Nov. 1—March 1 and must be removed during the lawn maintenance season.

All cemetery decorations are discarded by cemetery staff when they are determined to be old, unsightly, or create maintenance problems.

Mother's Day

All decorations will be removed the Friday following Mother's Day.

Memorial Day

All decorations will be removed the Monday following Memorial Day.

Christmas

All decorations will be removed during the third week of February, weather permitting.

Other holidays

All decorations will be removed two weeks after the holiday, weather permitting.


