Retail Sewer Service Line Disclosure

The retail sewer service lateral line is the pipe that extends between the main sewer pipe in the road and a home or business. Spanish Fork City is responsible for pipe repairs from the main line in the road to the property line on residential properties. All property owners are responsible for the cleaning and clearing of their entire service line. All users of City utility services shall keep their service lines and connections and other apparatus in good repair and protected from frost, trees, and other hazards at their own expense. No person shall be allowed to dig into a City right-of-way for the purpose of laying, removing, or repairing any utility line without first obtaining an excavation permit from the City.
