SMOKE DETECTOR CHECK



Every home should have a smoke detector in each sleeping room and in the common areas of the home. Smoke detectors should also be checked and tested regularly to ensure they are in good working order.

Testing these devices is easy. Push and hold the test button on the detector until you hear the detector activate. This should take only a few seconds and will shut off a few seconds after you release the button.

The Spring and Fall are always a good time to do these tests and to check the batteries. It is recommend that batteries be changed twice a year in order to make sure that they are always fresh. If you have a carbon monoxide detector, you can test them the same way.

Statistics show that these devices save lives only if they are maintained and are in working order.

IRRIGATION WATER TO TURN ON THIS MONTH

The pressurized irrigation water will be turned on by April 15 or sooner, depending on the weather. An exact date when the water will be available cannot be given because it takes several weeks to pressurize the system. However, water will be available first in the lower elevations of town and to all residents no later than April 15.


Before the water system is turned on, check now to be sure that your irrigation system is turned off, both at your system clock and at the water meter. This will help prevent unnecessary flooding which sadly seems to occur each year at unsuspecting homes across town. Don't let this happen at your home.

To make sure your PI water is turned off at the valve, locate your PI valve box (typically in your front yard in a

green box) carefully open the lid, checking for spiders that may have nested in your box, then locate the handle for your water line.

If the handle is in line with the pipe, carefully turn it 90 degrees so that it crosses the pipe (perpendicular to the pipe). When the valve is in this position, the water is off.

To turn the water on, simply turn the valve to be in-line with the pipe.
