
AN UPDATE ON RETAIL DEVELOPMENT IN TOWN

For the past several years, Spanish Fork City has worked with various developers and retailers to create new opportunities for commerce in the community. The City's motivation to create these opportunities is multifaceted. One of the City's main interests is to enhance the City's tax base. Much of the funds used to provide basic City services is derived from sales tax and, like most cities, Spanish Fork is consistently looking to increase sales tax revenue. Another City interest involves improving the quality of life for our residents. We believe the addition of new shopping opportunities in Spanish Fork can reduce our residents' need to travel elsewhere and that such change will be very beneficial for many in the community.

somewhat limited. Perhaps the best word to use in describing the City's role in attracting new business is facilitator. We work as City staff to make sure that the components required to serve retail development are in place. These components include things like streets, water lines and electric substations. Staff also contacts businesses that might be expanding in our area to make sure they know there are excellent opportunities in our community.

The most influential parties involved in retail development are retail developers and the retailers themselves. The City works diligently to make sure that the appropriate needs of these professionals are satisfied, but largely the City stands on the sidelines while other entities make commitments and decisions about development in the community.

Most recently, Spanish Fork City has enjoyed widespread interest from expanding retailers who have considered locations in Spanish Fork. While we are excited about the prospect

that several well-known retailers will open new stores in the community, so far only a few have applied for approvals and permits. Perhaps the best known retailer the City has worked with is Wal-Mart. Wal-Mart obtained a building permit earlier this year and will likely start construction in the next few months. While the City is not yet aware of exactly which retailers will eventually build stores in the area, we believe that we will learn much more once Wal-Mart commences construction. A conceptual plan for the Canyon Creek retail development is on the front of this newsletter.

We understand many residents are very interested to learn more about what retail development is planned in the City. We will provide information about plans that are in the works. Likewise, we will avoid speculation and avoid sharing plans or concepts that have not yet been finalized. ARE YOU REGISTERED TO VOTE?

You can check your voter registration online at www.elections.utah.gov or by calling the Utah County Elections office 801-851-8109. If you have changed your name or address, even within the City, it is necessary to re-register.

EARLY OR ABSENTEE VOTING

A registered voter can vote prior to the General Election at the City Office. Early voting is open **October 22 to November 1 from 1:00pm to 5:00pm**. Absentee ballots can be requested from the City Recorder at the City Office.
