UNHOOK HOSES AND PI SHUTOFF

The pressurized irrigation system will be shut off around the middle of October. Please plan your watering schedules accordingly. Once the system is shut down please be sure to turn off your sprinkler system. This will help prevent unintended flooding in the spring.

In order to turn off your sprinkler system, open the green pressurized irrigation box that is located near the sidewalk. Turn the valve in the box perpendicular to the pipe. See a video at spanishfork.org/pi detailing how to turn on/off your valve. Watch out for black widow spiders.

It is also a good idea to take the time to unhook your hoses from your outside water faucets. This keeps freezing water from bursting the pipes coming from inside your home.



SNOWSTORM PARKING

City ordinance requires that residents not park anything along the street once snow starts accumulating and during snow plow operations for up to 48 hours after a snowstorm.
